CALL TO ORDER

The Aledo City Council met in regular session on Thursday, February 27, 2014, at the Aledo Community Center, 104 Robinson Court, Aledo, TX 76008. Mayor Kit Marshall called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. with the following members present: Councilmember Jean Bailey, Mayor Pro Tem Bill McLeRoy, Councilmember Kim Hiebert, Councilmember Kerby Smith and Councilmember Matt Casey.

Mayor Kit Marshall moved the Library Report up to this item as Ms. Sue Ellen Shaw from the East Parker County Library was present to discuss the Library Events Report. Ms. Shaw gave the City Council updates on the Spring Events that were coming to the East Parker County Library, including the Historical Tour which includes 10 sites out of the Homer Norris Sketchbook. This will be held from 10am-2pm on March 29, 2014.

Mayor Kit Marshall stated that the City of Aledo has a Great staff and she is always proud when we can add to that staff. Director of Public Works Gordon Smith introduced the new Animal Control Officer, Alyssa Galyean to the Council and citizens present. Ms. Galyean started working for the City of Aledo on Monday, February 24th as the part-time Animal Control Officer. Ms. Galyean will be working approximately 25 hours per week. This is a position that was added into the 2013-2014 Budget. Ms. Galyean addressed the Council and stated that she was very proud and blessed to be a part of the Team.

Mayor Kit Marshall opened the Public Hearing to receive input regarding approval of the Development Plan for the Brookhollow Subdivision at 7:20 p.m. Mr. Chuck Stark the Engineer for the development gave the presentation to the City Council. This development will be done all in one phase for 127 homes with prices ranging from \$200,000 to \$400,000. There will also be a commercial building at the entrance to the development.

This item was approved and recommend by the Planning & Zoning Commission at their regular meeting on February 11, 2014.

Smith Survey, ABSTRACT No. 1223 and the J.G. WARREN SURVEY, ABSTRACT No. 2182, within Parker County, Texas

Mr. George "Pres" McGee of 167 Sanchez Trail spoke regarding the Final Plat for Brookhollow. Mr. McGee stated that this subdivision has the kind of streets he hates to see come into the City of Aledo. All the garages in this subdivision face the street. The streets are all straight with narrow lots. He asked the council to consider not approving this subdivision. The council stated that the developer has agreed to stagger the set-back for the garages to soften the look. The streets for this subdivision are being built to the city standards.

Motion was made by Councilmember Kerby Smith, seconded by Councilmember Matt Casey to approve the Final Plat for the Brookhollow Subdivision.

11. Discussion and action to approve a City Inspector agreement for the Brookhollow Subdivision project for construction inspection services.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Bill McLeRoy, seconded by Councilmember Jean Bailey to approve the City Inspector agreement with Multatech for the Brookhollow Subdivision project.

12. Public Hearing to receive input regarding an Ordinance to amend the Future Land Use Plan/Thoroughfare Plan

Mayor Kit Marshall opened the Public Hearing to receive input regarding an Ordinance to amend the Future Land Use Plan/Thoroughfare Plan at 8:01 p.m. City Engineer Robert McGee presented a power point presentation giving the updates to the Thoroughfare Plan and answered any questions the council had. Mr. McGee stated that this plan will align with the regional plans, update the new roads and also includes the trails and parks as set out in the Master Parks Plan from UTA.

There was no one present to speak for or against this item. Mayor Marshall closed the public hearing at 8:21 pm

13. Discussion and action concerning approval of Ordinance to amend the Future Land Use Plan/Thoroughfare Plan

There was no one present to speak for or against this item. Mayor Marshall closed the public hearing at 8:22 pm

16. Discussion and action concerning approval of the site plan, floor plan and design for the new Aledo City Hall.

Mr. Chuck Freeman and Alan Huckabee, Callahan & Freeman Architects, made a proposal to the City Council regarding a site plan, floor plan and design for a new Aledo City Hall. This project began in 2008, but with the addition of the Aledo Trail highway and the design in the downtown area, it is necessary to redesign the City Hall building. The existing building would go away and the new building would be built in its place including a new City Council room. The proposed building would be 10,389 square feet. Staff recommends approval of the floor plan, elevation and design. The funding portion of this would be discussed in the upcoming budget workshop meetings scheduled for this summer. The total estimated cost would be \$3,064,517.

Mayor Pro Tem Bill McLeRoy said he liked the floor plan and the site plan however he was not totally agreeable with the elevation. The building design presented does not reflect what develops in Aledo. The architectural design is not Aledo. Mr. McLeRoy stated he would like to see something that reflects the Aledo design and stone with the historic elements in place.

There was no action on this item. This item will be brought back to the City Council next month for consideration.

City Administrator Ken Pfeifer informed the Council that FM1187 and Aledo Trail project are on schedule and they will be pouring concrete in 2 to 3 weeks. The weekly meetings continue with the Public Works Staff. The Deadline for Aledo Trail completion is May 1, 2014.

Director of Public Works Gordon Smith stated that the completion date for FM1187 is targeted for September 1, 2014. Also, he was informed that the bridge at I20 and FM1187 will be widened once the FM1187 project is completed.

City Secretary Deana McMullen reminded everyone about the Circus Event on Saturday, March 15, 2014 with two showings at 2pm and 5pm.
